Economic Opportunity: All people deserve the chance to rise out of poverty, earn a living, and thrive economically.





Building Power with Visionary Leaders

Rise Up Leaders — women, girls, and allies with a clear vision for change — have been doing powerful work to advance gender equity and justice in their own communities. These are the stories of three visionary Rise Up Leaders.



Alicia Tauro Rise Up Leader since 2019, India

Alicia Tauro saw that too many children from poor communities in Mumbai experience abuse and harassment, so she mobilized support for Child Protection Committees, an innovative, preventative strategy to keep children safe. With training and funding from Rise Up, Alicia and her organization, Youth for Unity and Voluntary Action, rallied public support to get state approval to activate the child protection program. As a result of Alicia's advocacy and hard work, nearly 1 million children across Mumbai are safer.



I became part of a larger family of activists, leaders, and women who rise up for themselves and their communities to make the world a more equitable, just, and happy place.

Nsini Udonta Rise Up Leader since 2018, Nigeria

Nsini Udonta has seen the effects of gender-based violence in Nigeria first hand through personal experience and in her work at a domestic violence shelter. With Rise Up's support, Nsini advocated for a law to ensure domestic violence cases would be fasttracked for processing within 72 hours, protecting 4.5 million women and girls from violence in Nigeria.



My hope for the future is to see equity, opportunity, and social justice for women and girls in Nigeria and across the globe.









Veroníca Buch Rise Up Leader since 2009, Guatemala

Veroníca Buch didn't know what advocacy meant when she applied to become a Rise Up Leader, but she understood that she had to convince policymakers to take action to end the deeply-rooted practice of child marriage in Guatemala. Veroníca knew that often, young girls were forced into early marriage, exploited, and subject to sexual violence. For over ten years, Veroníca has mobilized girls, women, and their allies to create a more just and equitable country — including successfully organizing for Guatemala to outlaw child marriage in 2017. She is now part of a movement to ensure implementation of the new law and protect 2 million girls from early marriage.



For me, girls are important. They are the present, they are the future. Right now, they just need the opportunity to be able to rise up.
